Lyndhurst is a 4.72 square mile urban-suburban community of 22,000 people situated about 8 miles west of New York City. Economic growth has been significant with the growth of the Meadowlands Industrial Parks and the New Jersey Sports Complex. Its community members are involved in manufacturing, technical and managerial work, skilled and unskilled occupations and small business enterprises.

High School

Lyndhurst High School is a comprehensive high school, Grade 9-12, which provides a full range of academic, business and vocational opportunities for every student. Our student population is approximately 700.

Students are offered a wide variety of interscholastic athletic programs on the sub- varsity and varsity levels. An extensive co-curricular program affords students the opportunity to serve in various clubs and activities.

Honors Courses

Honors courses are offered in English I, II; Foreign Language; World History Honors, United States History I; Algebra II; Geometry; Biology Lab and Chemistry.

Advanced Placement Courses

Lyndhurst High School offers an Advanced Placement course in Calculus AB; Computer Science II; Microeconomics; Spanish; United States History II; Government & Politics; Physics English Composition, and English Language and Literature

Middle College Program

In cooperation with Fairleigh Dickinson University, students may be eligible to receive college credits for Human Anatomy & Physiology taken at Lyndhurst High School.

Accreditation

Lyndhurst High School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, approved by the New Jersey Department of Education and permanent member of the College Entrance Examination Board.

Career Exploration

Careers are explored through infusion in all courses at Lyndhurst High School.

Transcripts and Class Rank

Each student's permanent record contains information recommended by the NASSP and is in compliance with the New Jersey State law. Transcripts will only be sent upon receipt of a signed request of the student, parent, or guardian. Class Rank, expressed in a 4.0 system, is computed by a numerical process, which encompasses all subjects and includes all students in a graduating class.
